

KM Yachtbuilders turns hull for Tom Waes's Bestevaer yacht




KM Yachtbuilders marked a significant milestone in the construction of TV personality Tom Waes's new yacht, the Bestevaer 53 'Tethys' by turning its aluminium hull. This crucial step signifies the progress of the project, eagerly anticipated by Waes and the shipbuilding team.



Following the hull turning, Waes was visibly thrilled. "I'm happy. Really happy. The last time I saw the ship, the first 3 metres (9.8 feet) of the bow had just been built. And to now see this... incredible!" he remarked.

The Bestevaer 53 'Tethys' stands out not only for its design but also for its commitment to sustainability. Constructed with 70% recycled aluminium, the yacht will feature an electric drive and a regenerating propeller. The interior will be crafted from bamboo, housing three cabins and ample storage space in the bow, ensuring both comfort and practicality.
