Fever for black Tulip?

Another take on the cruiser-racer type, Tulip is, we suggest, a more practical solution for cruising

This classic-looking 88-footer is designed for cruising either side of the Atlantic, but with racing capability. If you like the neoclassic style there is no better exponent than German Frers, who has designed *Tulip* with a straight stem and an elegant counter, but with none of the complexities of a bowsprit or gaff rig.

This yacht will be built in aluminium by the increasingly influential K&M yard in Makkum in northern Holland. She will have a fully fitted-out interior designed by Sinot Yacht Design – 'natural colours such as brown, beige, cream and grey will alternate with the intense dark orange recurring in the detailing,' is how they describe it.

Unlike Singularity, this yacht has a lift keel with a mirimum draught of just 10ft 6in, much more practical for cruising, but unlike the Lutra boat, her displacement is almost double at 43 tops (lightship)

On deck she has some interesting cockpit features, including fold-down helmsman's seat backs to increase deck space and glass panels which rise out of the coamings to provide a wind and weather shield when at rest. www.kmy.nl
